These funds will be used towards sponsorship of indigenous medical scholarships. Faye and John are very generous supporters of our Club

in so many ways. They are also sponsoring the District Conference in 2012 with a donation of \$30,000. The 2012 conference will have a strong theme of Indigenous Education and Health and PP Trevor Pang is on the District Planning Committee for the District Conference 2011-2012.

PDG Judy continued, "What an incredible gesture from Faye and John and one for which the credit and many thanks must go to Trevor Pang for exercising his considerable charm and powers of persuasion!" Trevor shares his business address and floor space with Motto Fashions - poor Faye and John just can't escape him!

Because of the importance of this donation, Australian Rotary Health are setting up a sponsorship

arrangement with Deakin University to offer a post-graduate nursing scholarship to an indigenous person who is looking to take their skills back to their communities. This will count for approximately half of the donation and the balance will go towards sponsorship of indigenous scholars who are in their second year of studies in a medical field. These scholarships are jointly funded by the Commonwealth and/or State Governments.

PDG Judy said that it is hoped that our Club can build up a meaningful relationship with all of these beneficiaries of Faye and John's overwhelming generosity.



EXCERPTS OF PRESIDENT JO COWLING'S CHANGEOVER CELEBRATION SPEECH 2010-2011

President's Message -

The Rotary International Theme for 2010-2011 is 'Building Communities and Bridging Continents'.

ROTARY CLUB OF RICHMOND INC This theme reflects the Rotary Club of Richmond's commitment to our local and international community. In the year ahead we will continue to welcome and **build** the relationship we have with the City of Yarra, with our sponsors

and with local business and **community** groups. The Rotary Club of Richmond has a strong history in the City of Yarra having been chartered 46 years ago on the 24th August 1964 in what was then the old City of Richmond. We will celebrate this anniversary again in August. The Club has always had an active role in the community and we wish to remain a relevant and vibrant force through our many projects. I warmly welcome to our Changeover tonight Yarra Councillor, Amanda Stone.

In the coming year the Club will provide ongoing support to our very successful **Community Service** Projects, New Generations and Vocational Projects. These include the Rotary Youth Arts **Projects (RYAP)** and **Next Step project** aimed at providing disadvantaged youth with skills to assist them in achieving their goals. We also focus on our education projects including the Mock Job Interview Program held at Melbourne Girls College, Richmond; the Yarra Primary School Kitchen Garden Project; the Slade Literacy Award, the Ainger Public Speaking Awards and the Victoria Police Mentoring Program. We will also achieve success through Rotary Programs which encourage student participation in the Mock United Nations Assembly, Rotary Youth Personal Enrichment program; National Science Awards to name but a few. We continue to look at projects which will engage the **OXYGens** (Our XY Generations) through meaningful and relevant community projects. I would like to thank them for their response to the Bush Fires Fence Building Project carried out following the fires last year. The Club will look at ways in which we can support the indigenous people living in the City of Yarra through the **Indigenous Diabetes Health project**, with additional support from our Heritage Cluster Rotary Clubs. This year the Heritage Cluster will expand to include the Rotary Club of North Melbourne and the newest Club, the Rotary Club of Melbourne Park. Our Community support will continue with our involvement at the Abbotsford Convent, the annual Clean Up Australia Day participation and the Ambulance Victoria initiative: 4 Steps For Life - CPR Program.

Internationally we will **bridge the continents** through our **International project, the Kindy Box project in East Timor**, ensuring kindergarten teachers and students continue to benefit from this unique Club-driven initiative. We will support children who require medical aid through **ROMAC** - Rotary Oceania Medical Aid for Children. The Club will continue to proudly support **Australian Rotary Health** whose primary mission is to fund medical research by Australians for Australians. This past year ARH endowed 10 pilot research studies under the initiative 'Mental Health of Young Australians'. A strong Club Services Committee will ensure that our club is administered successfully and we continue to have an interesting and stimulating program, fun in fellowship and ensuring that our **Friends of Richmond Rotary** (FoRR) remain a vital part of our Club.

We will be kept informed through a weekly edition of the prize-winning bulletin, **The Tiger Rag**, along with an engaging and informative **Club website**. We also need to recognize the achievements of the past and will collate and maintain an archive of the Club's history and records.

The **Rotary Foundation** is the charitable arm of Rotary and we will continue to support the Foundation through program participation and financial contributions. Richmond Rotary will also participate in the **Future Vision** pilot which will help to refine the Foundation's new grant structure. Past President Trevor Pang will be a representative on this District committee.

The Club's Leadership Team will help us to achieve our goals and achieve a healthy and wealthy Club...... My vision for 2010-2011 is to involve all Members of the Club and so in this year I have appointed the Committee Chairs to oversee the Club's projects and programs, and have allocated each Member of the Club to a committee. Topic: Leadership in Antarctica: Managing Davis Base for the

Australian Antarctic Survey

Synopsis: In the 2008-09 season, Bill De Bruyn took on the role of Station Leader at Davis Base for the Australian Antarctic Division. The Australian Antarctic Division leads Australia's Antarctic program and ensures Australia's Antarctic interests are advanced. The Australian Antarctic program has 4 goals: Maintain the Antarctic Treaty System and enhance Australia's influence in it; protect the Antarctic environment; understand the role of Antarctica in the global climate system; undertake scientific work of practical, economic and national significance.

Bill is a Divisional Superintendent with Victoria Police. Since joining the Victoria Police Force in 1972, at the age of 18, he has performed duties in all facets of policing, including task forces and crime squads. He has also been in charge of country and metropolitan police stations and major events such as the Australian Motorcycle Grand Prix at Phillip Island. He has won several national and state crime prevention awards. Bill is actively involved in his local football club and enjoys most outdoor sports.




