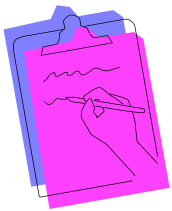

DECEMBER IS ROTARY INTERNATIONAL FAMILY MONTH

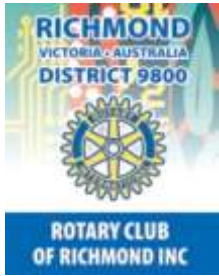

'Outlook', the human interest radio programme of the BBC World Service, focuses on 'extraordinary personal stories from around the world'. The producer read the story of K' Chin and how he was brought to Australia by ROMAC and has just been named Queensland's International Student of the Year! Guest Speaker: Mary-ann Liethof
Topic: Post-Polio Syndrome
Chair: Elissa Marriott

Mary-ann Liethof worked as the Coordinator of Polio Network Victoria, from mid 2004 to December 2009. During that time, Mary-ann was one of the Victorian representatives on the Management Committee for Polio Australia. Following a small philanthropic grant and a private donation, Mary-ann was officially appointed as Polio Australia's National Program Manager in early January 2010 on a part time basis. She also works part time as a Policy Officer with the Council on the Ageing. Mary-ann's qualifications include a Diploma in Community Development as well as a Graduate Diploma in Careers Education. She has worked in the community sector for more than 20 years in various positions including: vocational counselling, training, coordinating volunteers, community education, and liaising between community members and GP's for a Division of General Practice.

In April/May 2008, Mary-ann visited 10 post-polio related services across North America on a Churchill Fellowship Study Tour, the purpose of which was "To identify techniques to better manage the late effects of polio".

In April 2009, Mary-ann travelled to Roosevelt Warm Springs in Georgia, USA for Post-Polio Health International's 10th International Conference: *Living with Polio in the 21st Century* and a 4 day Wellness Retreat to learn the benefits of this self-management model. With this knowledge, she facilitated Australia's first Wellness Retreat for 60 polio survivors and their carers in April 2010 in Baulkham Hills (NSW), and is currently working on the next one to be held in Mt Eliza in April 2011.

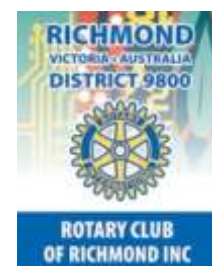

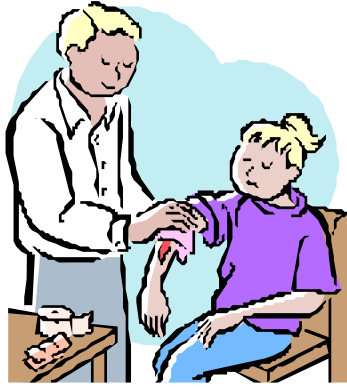
BUILDING COMMUNITIES. BRIDGING CONTINENTS.

LAST WEEK'S SPEAKER'S CORNER

Meeting 2121, Monday 6th December, 2010



Our Guest Speaker: Kate Archdeacon
- Design Research Assistant
Her Topic: VEIL (Victorian Eco-Innovation Lab)

Very Special Reporter: PP Brian List

Kate Archdeacon enthusiastically explained her role in **VEIL (Victorian Eco - Innovation Lab)**. VEIL is sponsored by the University of Melbourne and Kate is also the Blog Moderator. VEIL facilitates solutions to the future of sustainable cities in Victoria. For example Kate has developed design briefs for Year 3 Architectural students and has acted as a Consultant for Ballarat City Council.

Some of the questions dealt with are:

1. How well will Melbourne cope with a population that is over 50% larger?
2. Where else is there an available model of the kind of community that Melbourne may become?
3. Are there influential groups growing that see a solution ahead?

The response to these includes: VEIL and the Blogs; visions for the future; projects from around the world; local actions at different scales; questions and hopefully answers. Kate's Blogs are currently receiving 7,000 visits per month and she has recently returned from Mexico City where she attended a conference: *'Living Well. Consuming Less'*.

Some of the future solutions to Melbourne's Sustainability involve - use of rail rather than the present highly polluting road transportation; improving basic health of Melbourne's population by encouraging walking to shops rather than driving to them. **Areas of opportunity** - localised production and consumption, solar panels, growing food, catching storm water. **Distributed Systems:** Avoiding waste, energy feed-in to the Grid. **New systems and services:** Sharing cars, tools, appliances. **Green Economy Jobs:** Grey water plumbers, solar panel maintenance, food preserving. **Healthy Communities: Walkability** - public transport, new housing models. **Sustainability** - a low Carbon Society: More resilient to changes in the climate, including extreme weather events and to the effects of escalating oil prices as global demand outpaces supply.

Distributed Systems and Resilience: Over the next few decades the way people obtain their food, water and energy will undergo a major (r)evolution. **Recent Proposals** include the use of the North Melbourne Rail Yards for high density Housing. In reality this means an extension of Docklands.

Another project involves the rejuvenation of Broadmeadows through appropriate Town Planning of the area. **Visions of The Future Collaboration - Design students from four Universities:** University of Melbourne, Monash University, Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology and Swinburne University. The costs involved will be provided by the Victorian Government Sustainability Fund - managed by Sustainability Victoria.

EXERCISE FOR ROTARIANS & FoRR'S OVER 50

- *Begin by standing on a comfortable surface, where you have plenty of room at each side.
