

Meeting 2124, Monday 17th January 2011

Guest Speaker: Michael Staindl
Topic: The Zero Carbon Australia Plan (ZCA)

Michael Staindl is a presenter for Beyond Zero Emissions Inc. (BZE), a not-for-profit, volunteer run, climate solutions think- tank. A nuclear physicist and software engineer by training, he has spent 20 years in Information Retrieval and Management in both public and private sectors and a further 15 years in home and building automation with his own company, SMART Systems Pty Ltd. As our Guest Speaker, Michael will talk about his work with BZE and their Zero Carbon Australia 2020 (ZCA) initiative. BZE's core goal is to facilitate the implementation of the social changes and technologies that will reduce the impacts of climate change and give our society and global ecosystems a chance of surviving into the future. To this end, BZE in conjunction with the University of Melbourne's Energy Research Institute and others has developed the ZCA initiative. It is a project to develop a blueprint for the transition to a decarbonised Australian economy by 2020.

Michael believes this is one of the most serious - and enlightening and optimistic - contributions to the sustainability debate Australia has ever had. This cutting-edge plan is the culmination of some years and thousands of hours of pro bono work by engineers, scientists and postgraduate students. It is a detailed and fully costed blueprint for transitioning our stationary energy sector to 100% renewable energy in ten years. The technologies utilised in BZE's plan are commercially available now. This is, the BZE team believes, the only way we can go if we wish to avoid irreversible damage due to uncontrolled climate change. And we need to move now!
