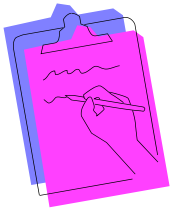

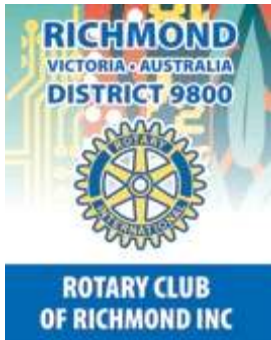


**CLEAN UP AUSTRALIA DAY 2011 –
JOIN RICHMOND ROTARY TO HELP CLEAN UP
BURNLEY PARK!**

With the encouragement of our Club President, Jo Cowling, last week Rotarians' Annie Wysham and Kristen O'Reilly, along with Chew's daughter Susanna Chan, FoRR, and her friend, 'JJ' Richardson – here from the USA on a tourist visa – met for a productive lunch meeting and fellowship opportunity to discuss Richmond Rotary's involvement in **Clean Up Australia Day to be held on Sunday 6th March 2011.**

With the support of the City of Yarra, as in 2009, our registered Clean Up site will be Burnley Park and once again Burnley Oval will be the base station for commencing and completing the clean-up activities, followed by a free Rotary BBQ. Various local interest groups, staff and students from the Melbourne Girls College and the Richmond community will be invited to join us in our initiative including some members of the Golden Key International Honour Society – Susanna is the Relations Officer. Posters and media articles are being prepared under the guidance of Susanna for advertising purposes.



Our 2011 Clean Up sites will be:

1. **Base Station & C/U Site:** Burnley Oval and surrounding park land.
(Mel Map: 2H/9-10. Enter off Park Grove, Richmond)
2. **C/U Site:** South side of the Burnley Rail Line – Madden Grove
3. **C/U Site:** Boulevard from Monash Freeway to Rail Bridge
4. **C/U Site:** Bike Track from Fenix Café to Rail Bridge

All participants will meet at the playground/BBQ area at Burnley Oval to complete their registration and briefing. The base will provide communication and the necessary support for the participants. Volunteers will be issued with collecting equipment (BYO gardening gloves would be great though). They will be assigned to one of the four selected sites within the vicinity of Burnley Oval, each site to be supported by a Team Leader.

LAST WEEK'S SPEAKER'S CORNER

Meeting 2124, Monday 17th January, 2011



Our Guest Speaker: Michael Staindl
His Topic: Zero Carbon Australia Plan

Michael Staindl was a very interesting and thought-stimulating speaker. He started his talk by asking those in attendance if they believe that there is a problem re climate warming; if they believe it is man produced, or if there is a beginning of interest in this problem. The result in this small group was one third for each. He then discussed the Zero Carbon Australia (ZCA) Plan 2020 and the Beyond Zero Emissions (BZE) Inc., the not-for-profit, volunteer-run climate solutions think-tank. It aims to create a plan to re-power Australia with 100% renewable energy in ten years. Some of the problems regarding the proposals are that there are 'Can't Do' people who believe we *can't* provide base load power using renewable energy and who are not looking beyond 10 years; and who are not realising that we have to be planning for the next 100 years, or even longer! The 'Can Do' Camp *accepts* current climate change evidence and realises what has to be done and when and uses only existing tools.

Michael referred to Professor Mark Jacobson of Stanford University, USA, who has plans to use all renewable energy by 2030 - large wind turbines, solar energy and geo-thermal energy. He stated that there needs to be a renewable mechanism to boil water to give steam to generate to give electricity. 'Batteries are not the solution, but molten Potassium Chloride and Sodium Chloride in storage tanks can store energy for 16 hours, so that solar can give energy for 24 hours. Energy is used by moving from hot to cold tanks.' Solar Thermal Plants would supply 60% of Australia's energy - each module generates 220 mega watts; 19 modules will have a capacity of 3500 megawatts and water is provided as well. There will be 12 plants distributed across Australia. Spain, which is a country like Mildura, (temperature and solar wise), is using Solar Thermal Plants. Wind power can provide another 40% of energy. We would need 6,400 turbines - Germany has 19,000! Another form of energy storage is pumping water up during sunlight hours, and letting it run down in the evening to generate energy. The development of Renewable Energy systems would increase employment with use of Concrete and Steel.

Added comments: America and Australia are the worst polluters in the world. We are being left behind by China with the use of solar energy etc.

Disaster Aid Australia General Manager, Jenni Heenan, said, “We have been in contact with the Queensland government authorities offering support and aid in the form of tents and also the expertise of our Disaster Aid Response Team members.
