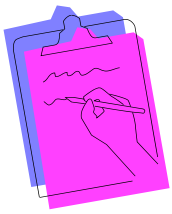

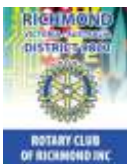

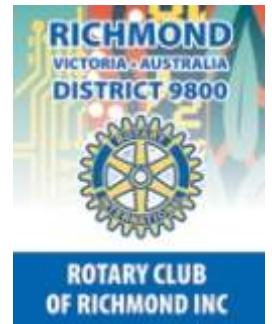

Bev Grant on Martin Grant: From Melbourne Schoolboy to Fashion Designer for the Stars

Bev Grant is indeed a proud Mum – and with good reason. In 1996 her son, Martin Grant, opened his first Parisian boutique in an old barber shop in the historic Marais district. For a boy born in Melbourne in 1966 and brought up in the suburb of Blackburn, and who attended Nunawading Primary School then Nunawading High School, it's a long way from home! Bev said that when he was only 18 months old Martin began to show an interest in the form, shape and texture of things – leaves, stones, flowers etc. She even kept his 4 year old drawings (rolled and stored in the garage) which she shared with us in a power point presentation. An exhibition highlighting some of his works & creations featured at The Ian Potter Centre: NGV Australia, Federation Square, December 2005-May 2006. Spread over 3 rooms it included the (now) framed drawings! Drawing women in ball gowns at kindergarten and spending weekends with his seamstress grandmother learning to sew, Martin Grant's potential as a designer emerged at a young age. This Paris-based designer is now recognised as one of Australia's most talented fashion designers. Bev also made her own clothes and the much-used dressing up box for Martin and his sisters featured some of Bev's 50's and 60's inspired cast-offs! At 16 Martin left home to be a fashion designer; he launched his first ready to wear line in 1982 in his Little Collins St studio, using friends as models - including Kate Cerbrano - and featured in Vogue Australia when he was still a teenager. Bill Henson was the photographer! Awarded and recognized for his talent by the Australian fashion industry, following a rapid rise to fame, he decided to take four years off to study sculpture at the Victorian College of Arts. After graduating he realised he missed working with the three dimensional form of the body. Martin headed overseas to work in tailoring in London in 1991 then moved to Paris one year later. His first fashion parade was held in the street outside a Parisian café, attracting an appreciative crowd. Martin was honoured to be invited to 'dress' the statues of Château de Courances for an exhibition and Absolut for their 2000 calendar using an overscale lighted crinoline skirt to 'dress' their Absolut Vodka bottle! Martin's creation was the main feature! American Vogue has also featured Martin's collections. Bev shared her own photos of a recent parade held at his showroom and atelier in Paris, with Naomi Campbell a surprise model on the day. (She had fallen out with Versachi and was therefore available!) There the client can see and order from two collections at once - the running and the upcoming. Her 'behind-the-scenes' photos captured a show being prepared, the setting up, the models, the garments and the audience taking their seats (included Martin's 2 sisters). On the basis of his impeccable cuts, starting with luxurious coats and jackets, Martin Grant has attracted major retailers worldwide, including stores like Barneys or Neiman Marcus, plus boutiques like Takashimaya, or Penelope. Bev brought along 2 of her son's jackets which Jenny List looked lovely in - and Brian found it difficult to get them off her back! Bev was also wearing two beautiful pendants from Martin's latest jewellery range!

"Martin is friends with so many [famous] people we all know and read about, especially Cate Blanchett." Bev said, "But Martin only presents his collections to a rather small selected audience, deciding not to get caught up in the fashion system or follow trends." Where does he stay when he's visiting Melbourne? At home with his proud Mum in Blackburn of course!

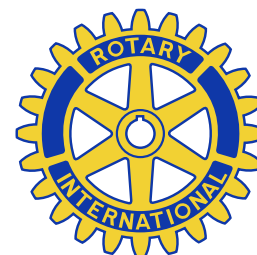

The Rotary Club of Melbourne Park, with the Rotary Club of Rochester, planned a weekend flood-recovery project on March 19-20th 2011.

Rotarian Krissy and her boyfriend Mark, and potential RCR members - Asvini and Shehan - along with several members from the Rotary Club of Camberwell travelled to Rochester for the weekend to join ten other willing helpers.

The weather was perfect for a couple of days of hands-on assistance for the local community. The bulk of the work was to remove damaged fencing and bundle up the wire for collection/re-use. The floods had caused the destruction of many useful farm and property fences; they will need to be resurrected in future, but our task was to clear the path for that to happen.

Other work included working down at the picturesque Campaspe River Reserve bush walking tracks. Fencing had been damaged in this area as well and needed to be re-constructed to encourage walkers to avoid areas of habitat. The team of helpers worked enthusiastically to assist in the protection and beautification of the area; also removing debris that had remained after the waters subsided.

Before the long drive back to Melbourne on the Sunday afternoon, in desperate need of a shower and nail-scrub, we were able to re-group in solidarity at the Rochester Tavern for some good food and fellowship. The flood recovery weekend was well-organised by the RC Melbourne Park and was a worthwhile Rotary opportunity.

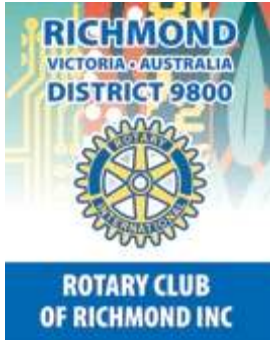

Mark Dohrmann is an engineer and ergonomist who runs his own business specialising in safety, ergonomics and advice to lawyers on personal injury claims. As a founding member of TADVIC - Technical Aid to the Disabled in Victoria - Mark has been involved in its development since 1975 and has served on the board since its incorporation in 1977. Mark was made a Member of the Order of Australia in June 1994, for services to people with disabilities, particularly through the organisation, TADVIC.

TADVIC's volunteers make custom equipment for people with a disability throughout Victoria. Their service helps people with disabilities, for whom no commercially available solution meets their needs. TADVIC has a metropolitan base, ten regional branches and over 175 active volunteers. TADVIC completes over 620 projects throughout Victoria every year. TADVIC is staffed by part time occupational therapists, and administration support staff, and is funded by a grant from the Department of Human Services and donations.

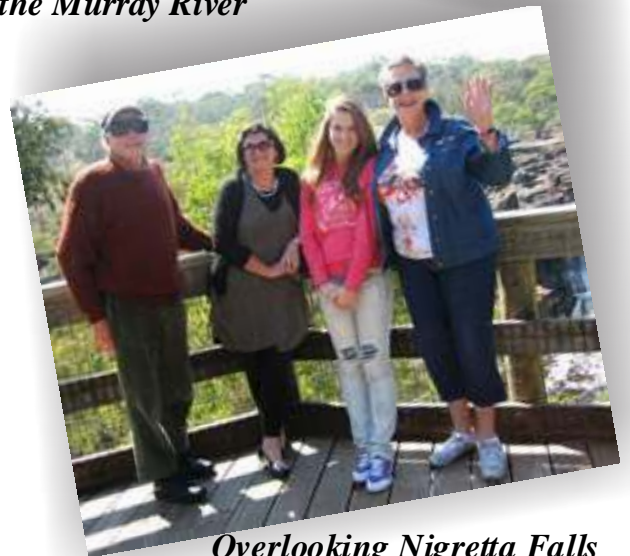
