



Dear Rotarians,

Enclosed are the Project Plans for this Rotary Year. They are divided into the five Rotary Avenues of Service, Club Service, Vocational Service, Community Service, International Service and Youth Service.

For many of our projects, the commitment made by the Rotary Club of Richmond is supplemented by others to give leverage to the total value of the project. For example:

- We have been **donated** 10,000 endotracheal tubes (ETT's) valued at an average of \$15 each (total value \$150,000) which have been allocated to third world hospitals in vital need of this type of equipment. With a total cost to the Rotary Club of Richmond of approx. \$3,000, **only** the cost of the freight.
- The Next Step Program is supported by volunteers in recruitment, finance and youth areas to ensure that the best training and outcomes are available to disadvantaged youth. Our \$13,500 contribution is leveraged to a \$140,000 project.

Another area of funding support is Australian Rotary Health Research Foundation. ARHRF provides funding for medical research. Via donations we are supporting two scholarships with another about to be commenced. The two that we support are:

1. A Post Graduate PhD Scholarship in Youth Mental Health. This scholarship has been awarded to Michelle Benstead and her research will be conducted on '*A Preventative Family-based Intervention for Children at Risk of Developing Depression in Adolescence*'.
2. Australian Rotary Health Indigenous Nursing Scholarship - Samara Rae (Cairns) Deakin University Geelong - Second Year.

The new scholarship will be:

1. Post Graduate PhD Scholarship Cancer Early Detection. This will be provided donations and will commence as soon as funding is finalised and applicants are assessed.

From an early planning meeting held in May the new board identified the goals of the club for the 2015-16 Rotary year. These were:

- Build a community within Richmond/City of Yarra
- Develop Projects which encourage involvement and community. (Lead Project)
- Create a long-term, viable, fundraising strategy
- Build active Membership

The Project plans outlined in this document show us as a vibrant and busy club and we value the contribution of all our members and the skills, talents and expertise they bring to our club. This is evident in the numbers of members that initiate, drive, or are involved in, the projects we call our own. We are proud to present the Rotary Club of Richmond Project Plans.

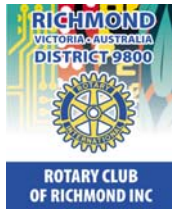

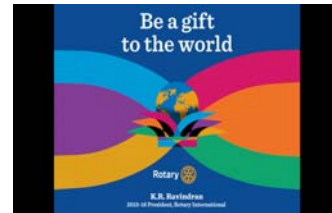
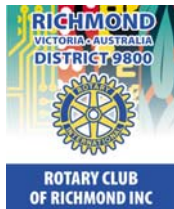

These kits would be sewn by members of the Rotary Clubs of Bairnsdale Sunrise and the Friends of Rotary Richmond with the assistance of the Days for Girls Camberwell chapter.</p> <p>Cat Wheeler would arrange for the relevant training to be provided to women at each of the Yayasan's. The Rotary Club of Richmond will arrange for the transport of the kits to Indonesia.</p>

GUM LEAVES – Green, Black and Red
